ELIMINATING TRANSPHOBIC LANGUAGE



Here are some common mistakes made by cis people:

Binary Language	"men and women", "trans brothers and sisters", "he or she" Instead: "students and faculty", "trans siblings", "they" It is important to recognize the existence of non-binary people through including them in our language.
"Biological	"biologically female" "female body" Instead: Say the person's gender, disclosing sex assigned at birth is generally none of your business Sex is not an objective science. We should allow every-
Sex" Anything	one to determine what their bodies mean to them. All women have female bodies. All men have male bodies. All non-binary people have non-binary bodies.
	Saying trans folks are female/male bodied undermines our genders and unconsensually categorizes our bodies.
Quantifying Trans People's	"male-identified" "self-identified woman" Instead: "man", "woman", "non-binary person" Using "identify" or its variants when talking about a trans
Gender	person treats their gender as less legitimate than a cis

person's gender. Trans people don't just identify as their genders, they are their genders.

Measuring Success by Passing "I would have never known you were transgender" Instead: "I love your dress", "You look great today"

Trans people should not be held to cisnormative standards of beauty. A trans person's worth or attractiveness is not based on "looking cis."

Language is not a replacement for other forms of trans community support. But shifting our words is an important step in shifting our ideas and actions.
